TURKU UNIVERSITY FOUNDATION GRANTS (1,1 M€), GRANTS FOR A RESEARCH RESIDENCY AT THE GRANÖ CENTRE AND POSITIONS TO A GRANÖ RESEARCH AND NETWORKING WORKSHOP

Turku University Foundation announces the spring 2020 Call for Applications for grants, Granö research residency grants and positions to a Granö research and networking workshop. The grants are available for teachers, researches, doctoral candidates and research groups at the University of Turku. The application deadline is 27 February 2020. All applications are submitted via the online application service. Decisions will be made in the board meeting 29 April.

Grants are awarded for the following purposes:

- young researcher grants (for work on a doctoral dissertation)
- research grants (for projects)
- congress and research trips abroad

The young researcher grant is a working grant for researchers of the age of 35 or under working on their doctoral dissertation. The amount of tax-free grant corresponds with the so-called artist grant, which amounts to $1939 \, \epsilon$ per month, including the statutory pension insurance premium payment when the grant period lasts for a minimum of 4 months. If the grant does not fall under pension insurance coverage, the monthly amount is $1690 \, \epsilon$. The grant is awarded for a maximum period of 12 months. The recipient must be free from other employment and able to concentrate on research.

A research grant may be applied by senior researchers coordinating or planning a substantive project (involving several people) or doctoral candidates who are not eligible for young researcher grants due to their age. Doctoral candidates may apply a personal grant only. If the application for a research grant includes an application for a personal grant, the monthly amount and the employment restrictions are the same as in the case of a young researcher grant.

When applying a *travel grant for a congress trip*, following attachments should be included in the application (1) an invitation to the congress / congress programme (a short version), (2) a presentation abstract (mandatory), (3) an abstract acceptance notice, (4) a statement on the content of the participation fee. When applying a *travel grant for a research trip*, required attachments are (1) a programme for the trip / a work plan and (2) a breakdown of expenses. The grant may be applied for <u>travel expenses</u>, <u>accommodation</u> and a <u>participation fee</u>. The Foundation does not support any other costs (meals, travelling day allowances, poster printing, ESTA, visa application). Please note! The grant can not be applied if travel expenses are covered by the university before the decision date (the university will not accept grants retrospectively).

Granö Researcher Residency Grants (Tartu, Estonia)

A researcher residency grant entitles the recipient to a free residency in the Granö Centre in Villa Tammekann designed by Alvar Aalto, located in Tartu (Estonia). The grant can be applied for the duration of one to three weeks in the autumn period 2020. The facilities and the environment are ideal, for instance, for a working period which requires particular peace or meetings of a small research or work group. Breakfast and use of sauna are included. Travel costs to Tartu and back are covered by the recipient.

Granö Research and Networking Workshop: Biological interactions from microbes to ecosystems 23.-29.8.2020 (Tartu, Estonia)

Five doctoral candidates from the doctoral schools of Faculty of Science and Engineering as well as Faculty of Medicine are selected to attend the workshop. The Turku University Foundation will cover the accommodation in Villa Tammekann, breakfast and travelling costs (Turku-Tartu-Turku). Professor emeritus Pekka Niemelä (UTU) and professor NN (Tartu University) will be the workshop supervisors. Five doctoral candidates form the Doctoral School of Earth Sciences and Ecology programme (Estonia) are also participating the workshop.

The online application service (https://tysaatio.apurahat.fi) will be opened 3 February 2020. The application must be delivered on Thursday 27 February 2020 at 12 PM at the latest. After the online application service is closed, the abstract acceptance notice may be sent via email to the grant secretary. More information is available in the online application service.
